Have you ever heard of the TAS2R38 gene? It's responsible for your experience tasting the bitter component in Brussels sprouts which may affect whether you enjoy them or not. These little cabbages contain more vitamin C than an orange, and 3 grams of fiber per cup. They are called Brussels sprouts because of their cultivation and popularity in Belgium in the 16th century. The biggest consumers of Brussels sprouts are in Britain, but the biggest producer is Mexico.
